# Aadhaar copy helps trace Jkhand man, held for $38 L$ theft

Mumbai: A Jharkhand man was arrested for theft of Rs 18.23 lakh committed at his employer's house in Santacruz. The accused, Jitendraprasad Mahato, was traced with the help of his Aadhaarcard photocopy that hisemployerhadmanaged to get from him before he had started working for him.

The cops have turned down Mahato's claim of burglinghis employer's house as he had not got his salary.

Mahato committed the theft when his employer Naresh Kadnani, a businessman, was away for work while his family stepped out on July 23 . Within 80 hours, the police managed to nab the accused and recovered a major part of thestolen booty. "Mahato burgled the househardly seven days afterhejoined as a domestic help at Kadnani's Santacruz flat. He made away with cash, gold and silver ornaments, diamond studded watches, shirts and perfumes," said a cop.

The theft was observed when Kadnani returned home and found Mahato missing. In the complaint, Kadnani said, "Iemployed Mahato only a week ago after he left the job six monthsago claiming that he was going back to his hometown. He opened the cupboard and stole shirts, perfumes and whatever valuables hecould lay hishands on, which he stuffed ina suitcase andfled."

Based on the complaint, deputy commissioner of police(zoneIX)ParamjitSinghDahiya formed a team and first got details of Mahato's brother residing in Santacruz. "Through Mahato's brother it was learnt that he hadmet himbeforeheleft the city. Mahato told his brother that he was going to Jharkhand as his son was unwell. He was nabbed on July 26," said the police.
