# Gates report praises Aadhaar, Jan Dhan scheme

ADEVELOPMENT reportreleased by the Bill and Belinda Gates Foundation has praised Aadhaar and the Indian government's efforts at financial inclusion through schemes such as the Jan Dhan Yojana.

This is the first "Goalkeepers: TheStories Behind the Data" 2017 report that will be published every year till 2030 - the deadline for the sustainable development goals (SDGs) - in a bid to diagnose urgent problems and identify key development solutions.
"India has been especially innovative about investing in the buildingblocks of digital finandial inclusion. Aadhaar, a nationwide biometric identification system, makes it simplerandmoresecure for poor people to do business. India's regulators have implementednew rules that give financial institutions greater flexibility to provide a widervarietyof services.... Anew class of bankscalled
payment banks has brought in new private sector players to the market and opened millions of new accounts. In 2014, the government launcheda programme called PMJDY (Pradhan Mantri Jan Dhan Yojana) to helpthe poor open accounts in huge numbers and it recently started providing benefits to them through these accounts," the reportsays.

The praise comes in the backdrop of continuing privacy concernsin IndiaaboutAadhaar. Italso comes whenthere is growingdistrustin the governmentonforeign agencies working in the development sector and the home ministry's crackdown on violators of the Foreign Contributions (Regulations) Act.

The Goalkeepers report quotes Rohini Pande, the Mohammed Kamal Professor of Public Policy, Harvard Kennedy School, "Digital has changed the nature of banking and made it cheaper to reach the rural poor," thereport says.
