Mumbai: Customers will soon be able to pay their shopping bills with their Aadhaar number. IDFC Bank has partnered TCS Merchant Pay to on-board merchants onto a digital payments platform that enables funds to be transferred into the shopkeeper's account using multiple channels, including Aadhaar Pay. One of the big retailers to be on-boarded onto Aadhaar Pay is Reliance Retail, which has several chains across the country. Besides enabling shopping via Aadhaar, Reliance will also provide customers option to do Aadhaar-enabled topups of Reliance Jio phones.
